- Valid on the day of validity in Baden-Württemberg, for any number of journeys on all local and regional transport
- Also available for 1st class

NEW: The Baden-Württemberg-Ticket is now also valid on weekdays from midnight to 3 a.m. the following day.

Centre for Art and Media Karlsruhe (ZKM)



The ZKM Centre for Art and Media in Karlsruhe is one of the world's most important museums, currently at fourth place in the ArtFacts global ranking. The ZKM was founded in 1989 with the mission of leading the classical arts into the digital age. Today, it is a globally unique cultural institution, a "mecca of the media arts" and a place of learning, research, and exchange. The museum brings together all media and artistic genres. Thematic exhibitions highlight specific arts such as painting, photography, and sculpture. Film, video, media art, music, dance, theatre, and performance are also showcased at the ZKM. Next door to the museum is the Filmpalast, a multiplex cinema.

Departing from Karlsruhe main station, take tram line 2 to the stop "ZKM".

Radolfzell am Bodensee



Radolfzell is located on the Untersee part of Lake Constance (Bodensee), about 20 kilometres north-west of Konstanz. No other place on Lake Constance has a longer walkable shoreline, so a stroll down the lakeside path is a must. From the ruins of Homburg Castle, you can let your gaze wander and enjoy the panoramic view of the lake, the Alps and the hilly landscape of the Bodanrück.

You can reach Radolfzell by direct train from Konstanz, Überlingen, Friedrichshafen, Singen, Engen, Basel, and Karlsruhe. The Höri bus connects Radolfzell and the towns on the peninsula with Stein am Rhein.

Heidelberg Castle

World-famous Heidelberg Castle is an icon of German Romanticism. Today, only its ruins remain, but they still offer spectacular views. With its picturesque bridge into the Old Town and its impressive architecture, a stroll through Heidelberg is always a special experience.

From Heidelberg main station, take bus 20 to the stop “Rathaus/Bergbahn”. From there, take the cable car to the castle.

Black Forest Treetop Walk



Sitting atop the idyllic Sommerberg in Bad Wildbad, the Treetop Walk lets you explore the local forest landscape from an entirely new perspective. Stretching 1,250 metres in length and up to 20 meters in height, the path winds through the impressive mountain forest, passing numerous educational and interactive stations. The highlight is the 40-meter-high, architecturally unique observation tower. The walk and the observation tower are easily accessible for wheelchairs and prams. Learn more about the flora and fauna of the Black Forest by exploring numerous information boards.

From Bad Wildbad railway station, take S6 to the stop “Uhlandplatz” (Sommerbergbahn), then take the cable car to the top of Sommerberg. It’s just a few minutes’ walk from there.

Hohenzollern Castle

Located at the edge of the Swabian Jura, the castle is a dynamic place that attracts hundreds of thousands of international visitors every year. Art lovers can marvel at the collection of paintings, precious silver, and porcelain, as well as the Prussian king's crown. The castle is a popular venue hosting concerts, an open-air cinema, and a Christmas market, among other attractions. Numerous hiking routes offer particularly stunning views of the castle from a distance. Tickets are only available from the online shop.

Departing from Hechingen train station, a bus goes directly to Hohenzollern Castle.

Outletcity Metzingen



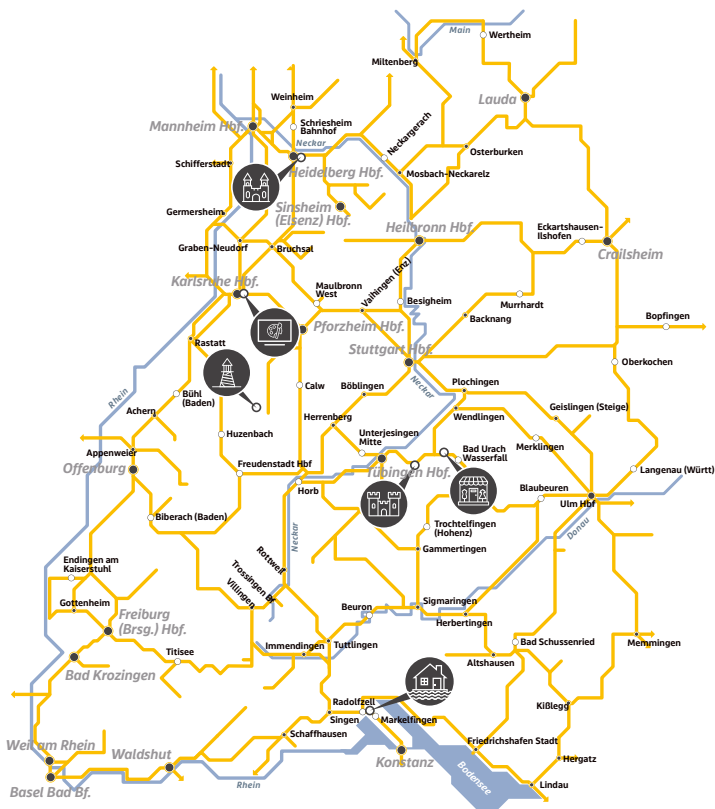
